McCain-Coons

Heller Voted Against The Bipartisan McCain-Coons Amendment To Offer A Pathway To Citizenship For Undocumented Individuals Who Arrived In The United States Before The Age Of 18 And Border Security, But No Funding For The Wall. On February 15, 2018, Heller voted against, “Motion to invoke cloture (thus limiting debate) on the Durbin, D-Ill., for Coons, D-Del., amendment no. 1955 to Schumer, D-N.Y., amendment no. 1958, to the bill that would provide conditional permanent residence to recipients of the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals immigration program if they meet certain qualifications, and would authorize \$110 million annually, for fiscal 2018 through fiscal 2022, for grants for border security activities in states with international or maritime borders. It would also authorize the construction of additional ports of entry along U.S. borders and would create temporary immigration judge and Board of Immigration Appeals staff attorney positions, to exist through fiscal 2020.” The amendment failed, 52-47. Schumer Amendment/Rounds-King

Heller Voted Against The Rounds-King Immigration Reform Amendment, Which Included A Pathway To Citizenship And \$25 Billion For “Various Border Security Purposes, Such As Physical Barriers.” On February 15, 2018, Heller voted against, “Motion to invoke cloture (thus limiting debate) on the Schumer, D-N.Y., amendment no. 1958, as modified, to the language proposed to be stricken by Grassley, R-Iowa, amendment no. 1959, to the bill that would appropriate \$25 billion, to be available from fiscal 2019 through 2027, for various border security purposes, such as physical barriers, technology and facilities. It would prohibit the deportation of recipients of the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals immigration program if they meet certain qualifications, and would reduce the cap on family-sponsored immigrant visas. It would require the Homeland Security Department to prioritize the enforcement of immigration activities for aliens that have committed felonies or misdemeanors, and those who are unlawfully present in the United States and arrived after June 30, 2018.” The amendment failed, 54-45. Heller: “I’m Telling You Right Now, I Cannot Support A Piece Of Legislation That Takes Insurance Away From Tens Of Millions Of Americans And Hundreds Of Thousands Of Nevadans.” According to comments Heller made about BCRA at a press conference, “Third, barring significant changes from the CBO, this bill will mean a loss of coverage for millions of Americans, and many Nevadans. I’m telling you right now, I can not support a piece of legislation that takes insurance away from tens of millions of Americans and hundreds of thousands of Nevadans. And lastly, the goal of healthcare reform should be to lower costs here in Nevada, and I’m not confident that it will achieve that goal. So make no mistake, the ACA does need fixing.
